VALUES: UKZN aims to establish a value-driven organisational culture that empowers the Institution and its people to achieve institutional goals

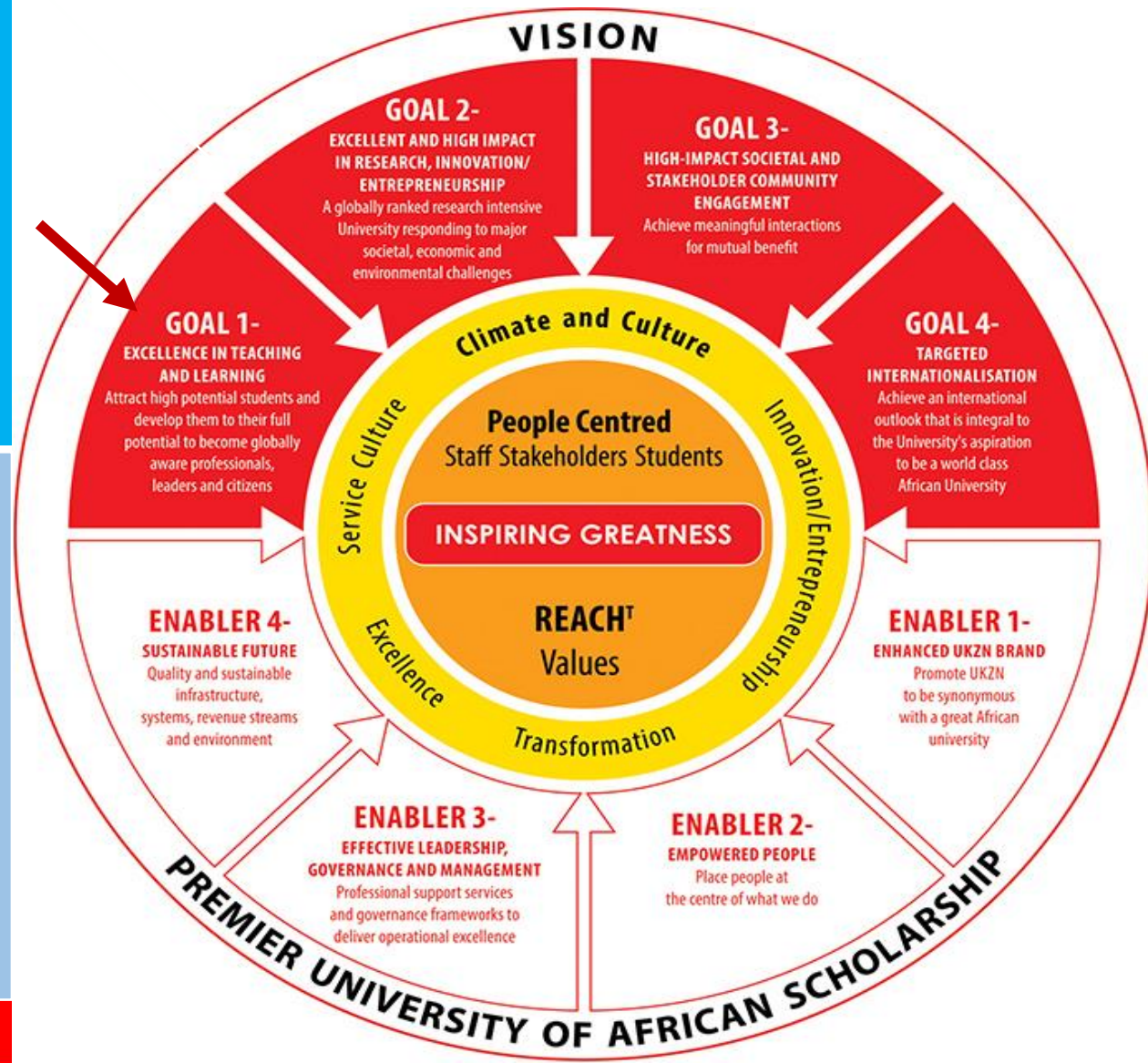

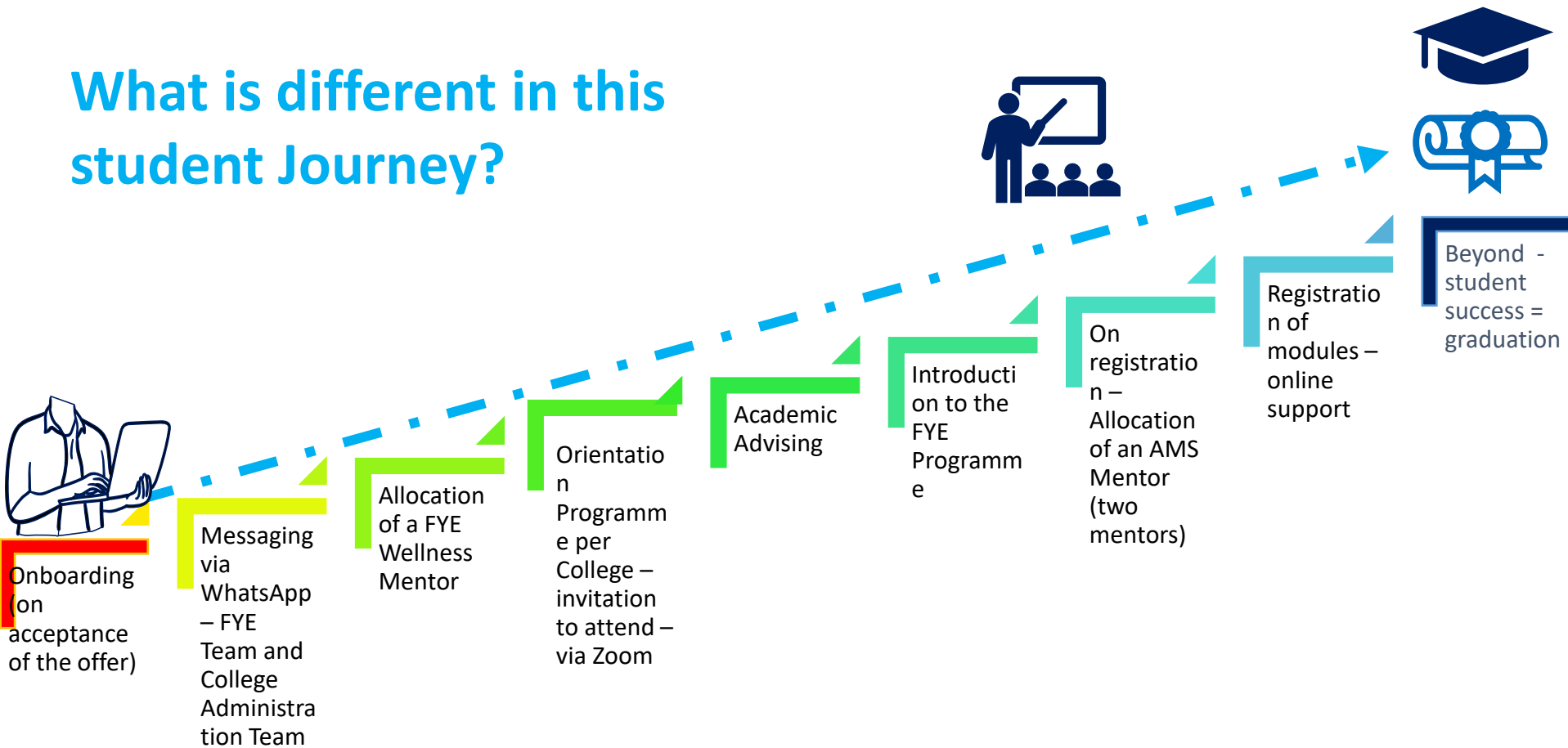

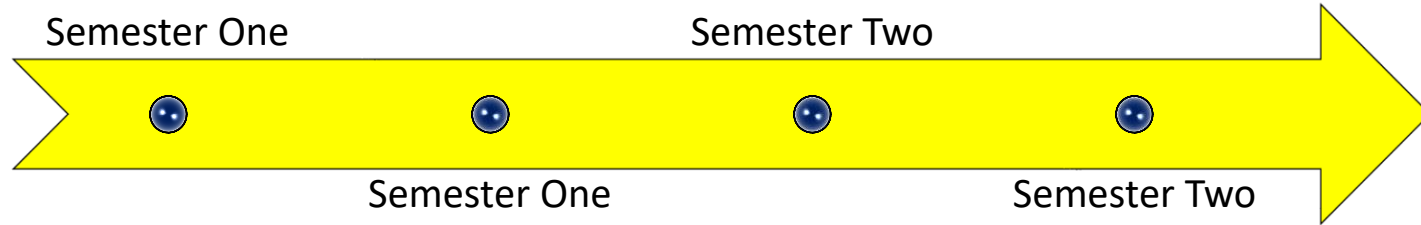
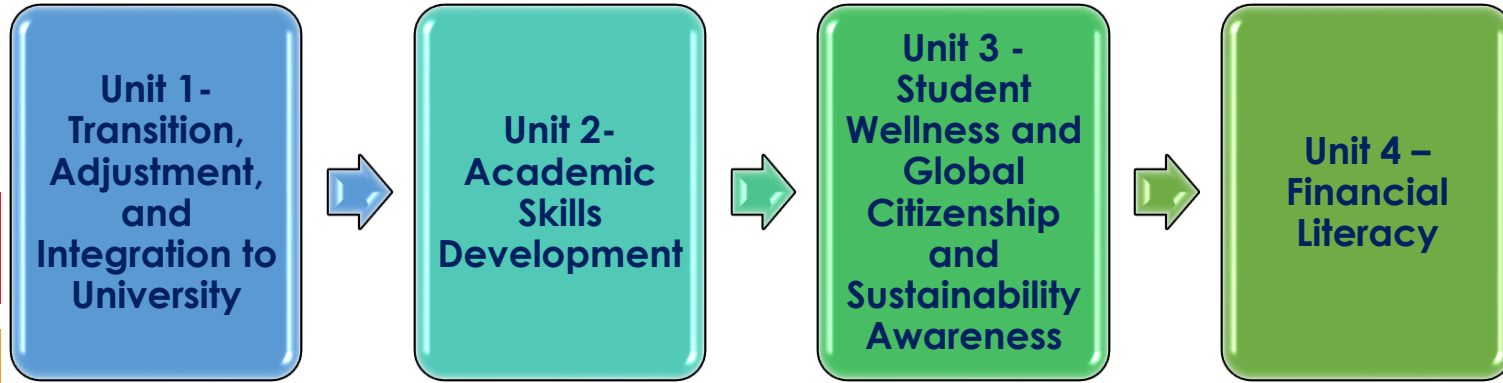


INSPIRING GREATNESS

Key Challenges

INSPIRING GREATNESS



Student

- Access to device
- Data connectivity – low participation on some of the units – unit 2 academic literacy (not mandatory/ certificate)
- Digital literacy [- registration on the LMS, use of the LMS for assessment submissions and saving of work
- Time management – co-curricular vs main curriculum



Peer mentors

- Inadequate facilitation
- Lack active engagement with mentees after orientation
