PROTOCOL FOR STUDENTS APPLYING FOR THE PHAKIMPILO PROGRAM

1. What is the PhakiMpilo program?

PhakiMpilo program strives to address student's uncertain or inadequate access to food due to financial constraints. Food security is phenomenon affecting a large number of South African households. DUT, as a microcosm of our larger society, is also impacted by this problem. Research has found that food insecurity is a growing concern within Higher Education institutions.


2. The PhakiMpilo Program

This programme is housed at Student Counselling Centre. The program is a two-month interim program for students who have challenges accessing food.



Student success beyond the classroom: Building Student Agency

One Residence One Garden (OROG)

- Student-led initiative, coordinated by the Green Campus Initiative (GCI).
- Students conceptualize innovative ideas on how to establish food gardens not bound by space, in both DUT owned and out-sourced residences.
- ✓ Gardens are established and managed by students in the respective residences with input from DUT staff (collaborative student-staff project)
- ✓ Key objective: to address food-insecurity experienced by students
- ✓ OROG was established and piloted in residences in July 2021 and has a presence on both the Durban and Midlands campuses.
- ✓ Currently: 105 OROG members; 58% female; 40% first-year students.






Student success beyond the classroom: OROG benefiting students

"These gardens are a blessing to me, when I'm stressed, I will just take a watering can and just water the garden"




